Dear Bishop Sullivan,

We are writing in response to your invitation to reflect on key themes for your upcoming series of Jubilee Pastoral Reflections to be published in *The Catholic Virginian*. We hope that you will consider devoting one of these articles to racism and the need for racial inclusivity in parishes. Racism is still a harsh reality in our diocese, both in society and in church.

Enclosed is one page of reflections from our Working Group. It is based on input from several different racial and ethnic faith communities within the diocese that we consulted. We urge you to write about these issues in light of Catholic social teaching:

"Racism is the sin that says some human beings are inherently superior and others essentially inferior because of race ... It is a denial of the truth of the dignity of each human being revealed by the mystery of the Incarnation."
