- These stories provide accurate records of past decisions and their consequences.

- Documenting personal experiences prevents loss and promotes truth.
- Stories build awareness, help avoid repeating mistakes, and celebrate achievements.
- They remind us that the church serves as a community and family, not just a place of worship.
